- Q. You can resume your seat. I'm sorry.

 A. I had the trigger-point shots in my n
 - A. I had the trigger-point shots in my neck. And they put a shoulder harness on me to restrict the motion of my neck and shoulders that day because they didn't want them moving because of the shots, which are very painful for the first day before they start taking effect.
 - Q. What impact, if any, did any of your infirmities or conditions have on your ability to walk?
 - A. I had been walking with a walker and a cane, sometimes around the house with a cane, but when I went outside, a walker, and I was too embarrassed to take the cane and the walker to the hearing. So I was driven to the airport and driven from the airport by someone else. I had not driven a car up to that point; I wasn't allowed. And I was helped down the steps to the hearing room hallway and helped into the hearing room; and the same when I left and after the hearing.

I did not stay for the whole hearing. I only stayed for my testimony, because I just wanted to get out there and get -- get out of there and get it over with.

- Q. Did your infirmities or conditions have an impact on your ability to walk?
- A. Yes. I couldn't walk by myself without somebody helping me.
